ROAD and SIDEWALK REPAIRS

Repair work has begun on Riverview's front entrance road and sidewalk. The work is expected to take 3 – 4 weeks. During this time, please allow for delays in accessing Riverview via the main entrance, whether by car, by foot, or by wheelchair. Work includes:


- 1. Repair of the asphalt at the main entrance road
- 2. Repair of the asphalt in the public parking lot
- 3. Repair of the sidewalk between the public parking lot and the AB building

ACCESSIBILITY DURING CONSTRUCTION (see map below)

- 1. Road to the front entrance (GREEN LINE)
- · Access for visitor cars and emergency vehicles only with expected delays
- \cdot Use SouthEntrance when being dropped off or picked up
- Green Line route will not be accessible to anyone for 24 hours while pavement work is being completed; during this time, vehicles will use the Blue Line route
- 2. Road to the front entrance (**BLUE LINE**)

 \cdot Access for visitor cars and emergency vehicles only, for 24 hours while pavement work is being completed

- $\cdot\,$ Use the South Entrance when being dropped off or picked up
- 3. Route to the front entrance (YELLOW LINE)
- · Access for pedestrians and wheelchairs
- 4. Bus stop near RHC main entrance
- \cdot The bus stop near RHC will not be available during the construction
- \cdot The bus stop on Eccles Street will be available at all times



LONG TERM CARE RESIDENT and FAMILY EXPERIENCE SURVEYS

In the next few days we will be mailing out our annual **Long Term Care (LTC) Experience Surveys** to residents and families. Both surveys focus on the care you are receiving, the people who provide that care, and the environment in which you are living.

RESIDENT COUNCIL MEETING

The most recent Resident Council Meeting was held on Friday, May 3, 2024, co-chaired by Jack Dalgleish, CD1 and Andre Hall Gruuska, CD2. Here are the highlights:

Outstanding Action Items

• <u>Food Choices</u>: Representatives from the Regional Distribution Centre accepted an invitation to join a small group of Resident Council members for a meal. Positives and negatives will be discussed for the improvement of our meal trays.

 Inviting the Premier: The Co-Chairs sent a letter of invitation to visit Riverview to the offices of The Honourable Wab Kinew, Premier of Manitoba, and Honourable Uzoma Asagwara, Minister of Health, Seniors and Long-Term Care. They are awaiting a response.
New Patio Furniture: Andre, Co-Chair, shared that the new patio furniture has been approved, with funding provided through generous donors to The RHC

Foundation. This includes accessible tables, chairs, lounge seating, and glider chairs, decorated with bright summer colours. Delivery is expected in June/July 2024.

New Business

• <u>Olivia Essex, Quality and Safety Counci</u>l: Olivia confirmed that the notes from the last Council meeting have been shared with the Quality and Safety Council, including renting common spaces, playing games with coresidents, and accessibility. She advised the group that handicap buttons in the main bathrooms (by the cafeteria),

CD1 door with push button access, wheelchair accessible patio furniture, and a new bicycle have been approved.

• <u>Dignity Quilts</u>: Victoria shared that RHC had received 50-60 'touch quilts' (also known as Dignity Quilts) from the Alzheimer's Society, specially handcrafted for residents of Riverview. She asked the Resident Council to consider how best to distribute them. • A resident of the 3W community requested that additional dining room chairs - removed during COVID, as they were not needed - be returned to allow ease of access for dining and for visitors. Victoria will follow up.

It's BBQ Season at Riverview!

You can make the most of summer by hosting your next family BBQ at Riverview! Patients, residents, and family members can reserve RHC's beautiful BBQ and Gazebo area for a special occasion or an everyday meal.

Visitors may cook BBQ foods providing they use RHC BBQ equipment. This equipment must be used in the Main or Pavilion Courtyard (in close proximity to running water). Here is how to get started:

- Contact Retail Food Services at (204) 478-6264 to arrange for access, training on how to use the BBQ, etc. Please note that a patient/resident's family member or visitor may BBQ food only for their own family (food cannot be served to other patients or residents).
- Prepare to eat up, then clean up!

"Long term care is relationship-based care. Getting to know the residents, spending time with them, getting to know their families, and creating care plans that make you an integral part of their extended family, is akin to being in their home caring for them," Victoria says.

Using Soap and Water

If your hands are visibly dirty, you need to wash them with soap and water. This way you can physically remove any germs that may be present. Here are the steps:

- Wet your hands with warm running water.
- Apply soap to your hands and rub them together to create a lather.
- Thoroughly cover all surfaces of your hands and fingers (including your nails) for 15 20 seconds.
- Rinse your hands under warm running water.
- Dry hands thoroughly with a single use paper towel or a hand dryer.
- Turn off the tap with a clean paper towel.



When your hands are clean, you help keep everyone safe and well. Thank you!

Many people with dementia do not want to accept help, even when it is clear to us that they need it. This can be frustrating for a care giver, but we have to remember that they have been independent for a long time and many of the things they need help with are very personal. Be sure to do small things to build trust.



DO IT TOGETHER

Do you ever have a hard time getting your person with dementia to do a task like eat, brush their teeth, or wash up? Try making a together-activity out of it.


